To mark NSW Grandparents Day in Penrith, the inaugural "Great Grandparents Day Billy Kart Race" will see grandparents push kids of all ages along a gentle

slope in the popular park.

"I used to make billy carts as a kid," said Alan Beard, of Emu Heights – one of the Nepean Men's Shed members helping make 18 billycarts for use on the day

They will also put on a barbecue for the participants. Kids at the childcare centres will paint and decor-

FIRE & RESCUE

"jaws of life" hydraulic gear that they carry to rescue people trapped, most often in a motor vehicle.

Born in January 1946 in Hastings, Sussex, England – the town where was a famous battle in 1066

Attended primary school in Hastings and secondary school in Hastings and also Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent, at the 'Skinners School' where I used to wear a straw hat and had to go to school on Saturday mornings as well.

Played soccer, cricket, rugby union, hockey and cross country running at school


and played for Horsmonden Minors (under 18 soccer team) for the village we lived in in Kent. He has also been

involved with the Scouts from Wolf Cub in Hastings, UK to a Group Leader in Lithgow until 1984.

Left home at 17 to start a career in coal mining in the Midlands of England. Boarded in a pub in a mining village for 5 years and obtained my mining engineering qualifications at Nottingham. Did various jobs within the UK coal mining industry whilst an apprentice and trainee mining engineer. Emigrated to Australia in 1977

courtesy of BHP to be night shift manager in one of their mines in Wollongong.

Trained in mines rescue whilst in the 'Gong', and joined Mines Rescue Service full time in 1980 in the Hunter then moved to Lithgow to be Superintendent at Lithgow Mines Rescue Station for 12 years until 1984 along with being with the VRA. Joined Standards Australia in 1997 as a project manager overseeing development of Australian and International Standards for the minerals industries. Made redundant in 2009 and joined the Lower Mountains Men's Shed and did volunteer work with Cancer Council and with a mental health program. He also collects glass cutters and mine safety lamps and gives talks to groups on mining history etc.. Previously Bob owned a couple of vintage motor cycles.


